OUR SUBLIMATION PROCESS

THE PROCESS

From idea to ink.

1. Brief

2. Concept

Once you've covered the basics of your order, it's time to work on visualising your idea.

Send through all your logos, colours and other design elements. It's important that these elements are separate files so we can alter them across each print file for your order. Our artwork team will then visualise your idea!

3. Layup

With the concept complete, it's time to prepare the print files.

Our production team will take the concept and lay it up on a garment pattern file, which will be used to transfer the design onto the fabric. We'll print this sample layup to test colours, sizing of elements and other print-specific details before running the entire order.

4. Production

If you're happy with our test print, send us your written approval.

We'll print all the different sizes, heat transfer them onto our high quality fabrics and sew them together, before giving them a nice iron and packing them up ready for collection. This process typically takes us 5 weeks from approval.

CONCEPTS

Sometimes things change a little!

Our digital concepts occasionally differ from the final garment during production. Here's what to keep an eye out for:

Colours

Colours will look different across all devices. Our printed lay up is the truest representation of the final print appearance.

Element sizes

We may scale certain elements to best fit across the sizes in your order. If you require a fixed size logo or graphic please mention it in your brief.

Panel joining

When artwork spans multiple panels, it is likely that the artwork will shift slightly during production creating a slight mismatch in the final garment.

MAKING CHANGES

Something is not right...

Making changes to your artwork is all part of the process. We'd really appreciate it if you could help us help you:

Production stage

It's important to know that once you've approved your flat panel print, changes cannot occur to the artwork past this point.

Options

Each concept is accompanied by an option number. Make sure you note which option your changes will occur on.

Naming files

If you have a few files you need to provide, we encourage naming them to help us track down the right elements. For example, a logo that goes on the left-hand sleeve might be named 'LH Sleeve Logo 1.png'.

Your left or my left?

We refer to placements as though we're wearing the garment: Left Hand Sleeve Logo (logo will sit on your left arm)

Prefer face-to-face?

Once an initial concept has been set up, you're more than welcome to book a time to sit down with us and amend your design in person.
